



Sapri (about 150 Km from Salerno) can be considered one of the most renowned centers for holidays in Campania.

The tourist port is one of the largest and best equipped in the coastal stretch; there are several lines of ferries to Amalfi and Positano.

You have to see: the “Bronze statue of Carlo Pisacane”, created by the artist Chiaromonte (1933), located in the port.



Placed behind Piazza Plebiscito, the old village of “Marinella” can be considered the real downtown of Sapri.

The village embodies all the ancient values of hospitality and catholic religiosity.

The “Church of Santa Croce”, erected in 1898, is a masterpiece of Gothic style. Dating back to 1730 and 1731, it is a masterpiece of Baroque style. On its bronze portal, by professor Carucci, it is represented the leadership of the Holy San Vito (Patron of Sapri).
